“My masterclass aims to empower practitioners representing Public Health or any of the less represented RA's in making rational, proportionate and valuable contributions to the process - whilst helping the other RA's to understand what Public Health et al can actually offer them and assisting to build stronger partnerships.

I have two decades of experience on both sides of the 'bar' having managed a venue as the LA 2003 came in to force, held a Personal Licence since 2008 and obtained all the Licensing Law education I have been able to find from the BIIAB Licensing Practitioner, BIIAB L2 award for Premises Assessment and Social Responsibility and most recently my level 6 Paralegal Practice qualification in Licensing Law. These qualifications are complemented with training qualifications, a decade of delivering the Award for Personal Licence Holders (APLH) and my position as a Registered Public Health Practitioner. My lived experience representing several Directors of Public Health over 6 years in a time where Public Health attempted to bed itself into the system is what I draw on for my present Masterclasses.

At the moment I am workforce development lead for Portsmouth City Council Public Health team, providing collaborative links with HEE and PHE, enabling my teams development and building capacity & capability in the wider work force.
